What is it?

Student nurses, midwives and allied healthcare professionals (AHPs) who commit to working in Wales for up to two years after qualifying are eligible to apply for the bursary. This provides non-repayable support covering tuition fees.

Swansea University

What is the commitment?

If you chose to access funding via the scheme, you commit to working within Wales for a period of two years for a minimum of 22.5 hours per week in the profession of which you've trained.

The process
